

INTERNSHIP SCHOLARSHIP IN GOVERNMENT FINANCE

MISSION – The mission of the Scholarship/Fellowship Program is to attract and cultivate the next generation of municipal finance leaders by providing tuition assistance, GFOAT exposure and work experience in government finance.

PURPOSE – Engaging local government leaders to cultivate and develop the next generation by offering an internship experience funded partially by a GFOAT Internship Scholarship.

INTERNSHIP SCHOLARSHIP AWARD:

- > \$2,500 to the chosen local government entity providing the internship experience
- > Paid attendance at GFOAT Spring Institute to the student chosen for the internship experience
- > One year membership in GFOAT to the student chosen for the internship experience



STUDENT ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA

The student must be enrolled as an undergraduate student completing junior year or more at a qualified Texas university by the time the internship scholarship is awarded. The candidate must be pursuing a major in accounting or in a related program in preparation for a career in state or local government finance. In addition, the candidate must have completed Intermediate Accounting I or equivalent at the time of application and have at least a 3.0 GPA.

Student candidate must be 18 years of age and able to work legally in the United States. The student must be able to pass a background check (and other hiring criteria of host organization). Student candidate must complete an application for the Internship Scholarship program by the due date, including a recommendation letter from a person able to attest to student's interest in state or local government finance.



STUDENT ASSESSEMENT CRITERIA

- Strong desire to work in government finance
- Substance of written proposal
- General academic performance
- Excellent communication skills
- > Leadership qualities through involvement in school activities or volunteer organizations

STUDENT RESPONSIBILITY FOR INTERNSHIP

- > Interview with participating host government entities and select entity of choice
- Fulfill duties assigned by host government in a satisfactory manner
- > Complete the full internship period
- Prepare a report of the internship experience including an evaluation of the program at the end of the internship period and submit to the GFOAT Scholarship/Fellowship Committee

GFOAT

The Government Finance Officers Association of Texas (GFOAT) is an association whose objectives include the professional practice of governmental financial management through sponsorship of educational opportunities for its members. GFOAT seeks to represent its membership by active study of the problems of financial management and by the encouragement of high professional standards.

Although not formally affiliated with the Government Finance Officers Association of the United States and Canada, the GFOAT shares many of the same goals. Whereas the GFOAT seeks to extend the educational and professional opportunities to its members on a statewide level, GFOA seeks to extend the education and professional opportunities on a national and international level.

The Association's activities are controlled by a Board of Directors made up of the elected officers and the immediate past president, and is affiliated with the Texas Municipal League (TML). TML is an organization dedicated to excellence in all aspects of municipal management and is represented throughout the State.

There are currently over 900 GFOAT members throughout the State of Texas. These members hold one of four (4) types of memberships: Active, Associate, Faculty/Student or Honorary.

Continuing education is accomplished through a number of venues, including conferences, seminars, scholarships, regional meetings and the GFOAT website. The continuing education training often fulfills the high standards required for the Certified Public Accountant (CPA), the Certified Government Finance Officer (CGFO) and other professional certifications.

The GFOAT established a foundation for the purpose of awarding a fellowship and scholarships in the area of governmental finance. The foundation has been established by donations from various sponsors and was named in honor of Professor Lynn F. Anderson. Thousands of Texas Public officials know Professor Anderson because of the continuing education and professional development programs he developed on their behalf.
