- Acting on professional values as a public finance official




















Trust is Our Most Valuable Asset



Change Ethics from Constraint to Enabler

If being "ethical" is defined as being more "trustworthy", then...

...when there is more trust in the finance office:

- Finance is invited to be part of important discussions and decisions for the entire organization
- Work is more efficient because there are more free flows of accurate information. People are more willing to share information.
- People are more willing to take risks, so there will be more innovation.

We, the government finance officers of the United States and Canada, have a deep and abiding desire to show that we are worthy of the special trust that the communities we serve have placed in us. As a member of my government's finance office, I commit to living the following values to show that I am worthy of that trust.

Integrity and honesty are the foundation on which trustworthiness. is built. It means people can believe what I say, I act in accordance with my deepest values, I put principle ahead of my own ego, and I do the right thing even when it is hard.

Public finance offices have an important job. Doing that job well honors the trust the public has placed in me.

TREATING PEOPLE FAIRLY

Local governments depend on trusting relationships. Therefore, I will treat people fairly and develop processes and procedures that are fair.

DIVERSITY AND INCLUSION

Embracing diversity and fostering inclusiveness helps finance offices cultivate organizations and promote policies that reflect the communities they serve. When people feel included, they see that I am concerned for their wellbeing. That shows I am worthy of their trust.

RELIABILITY AND CONSISTENCY

When I consistently apply my standards - especially to myself - I honor my commitment to the community I serve and make it easier to do the right thing even when faced with challenging circumstances.



Definitions

Power

The ability to achieve goals

Politics

Debate or conflict among those having or hoping to achieve power

Power Politics

Self-interested pursuit at the expense of the common interest



Three Principles

Don't Hate the Player

Power politics is a natural response to some incentives

Don't Hate the Game

Politics is how debates & conflict resolve in democracy

Change the Game

Channel power and politics in a positive direction

Finance Officers Exercise Power Through Ideas






"The finance officer knows things others don't"







If others can better appreciate the finance officer's worldview, they will be more receptive to the finance officer's ideas.








Trust is a finance officer's most valuable asset. The GFOA ethics program shows how to enhance trust.







Rather than "No", say "Yes, if ..."








Keep ideas simple, use metaphors and stories, and tune your language to suit the political environment.

















Cultivate relationships inside and outside of local government that can enhance your persuasive ability.



Agenda Setting Cards to Play

The finance officer often may not be the final decision-maker, but the public finance officer often *designs the decision-making process*.

Design the process to provide a better context for decision-making.

Asking the right questions, establishing clear priorities, and considering wise options is the essence of agenda setting and thereby "changing the game" of power politics.





Four Key Roles of the Decision Architect

- Widen the option set
- Test assumptions
- Find high-value options
- Foster trust in the process

Increased *chances* of the finance officer's ideas succeeding and changing the game of power politics in an ethical way








